The old Lucas Five and Dime Store on Main Street is several pieces that need replaced, an alternative is being looked at. Thanks to Sharon and David, the façade will be revitalized with a new awning installed.



The Design Committee is working on the old Lucas Five and Dime currently owned by Sharon and David Petty. The removal of the aluminum façade revealed the old Vitrolite glass that was original to the building. The use of Vitrolite and other pigmented structural glass reached its heyday in the 1920's and 1930's. This handsome and versatile building material, so much a part of the Art Deco and Art Moderne architectural styles, was used primarily for interior and exterior wall surfacing. There are only a couple places left in the United States to purchase this glass making it somewhat costly. Due to the fact that there

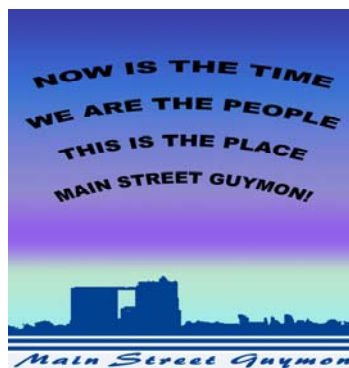
